The Downtown Westin Celebrates Grand Re-Opening and New Guest Spaces upon Fixing its damaged Windows

Atlanta, GA-- The Westin Hotel, which was damaged in a rare metro Atlanta tornado, announced its grand re-opening and held a ribbon cutting ceremony with Councilman Kwanza Hall to showcase its new meeting space for its guests.

As the Westin Peachtree Plaza celebrates its grand re-opening after a multi-million dollar window replacement project, it also is boasting about additional meeting space for hotel guests. Guests can access an additional 65,000 square feet of meeting space through a seventh story bridge connecting the hotel to 200 Peachtree, in the former Macy’s space. The two buildings offer a total of 145,000 square feet of meeting space.

The former Macys building at 200 Peachtree, which is now connected to the hotel and a Philip Shutze-designed historic landmark, will share catering facilities with the WestinPeachtreePlaza, tapping the hotel as a preferred caterer. 200 Peachtree specializes in event space, exhibition space and will soon welcome restaurants and retail opportunities.
